CALIFORNIA'S REEFS IN CRISIS

Stretching over 1000 miles from San Diego to Eureka, the California coast attracts millions of people every year and supports an ocean economy worth \$43 billion annually.

Offshore, just below the surface, kelp forests and rocky reefs are home to countless species of marine life. From the time when Native Americans paddled the Channel Islands to the time of Steinbeck's Cannery Row, the ocean provided a seemingly endless bounty. Unfortunately, over the past thirty years, the health of the ocean ecosystem has suffered from pollution, overfishing and poor coastal management. Historically important seafood such as abalone and boccacio rockfish have become rare in some parts of their range and several fisheries have been restricted or closed.

The good news is that it is not too late to reverse this decline in ocean health. Just as it is important to test the quality of the water we swim in, it is equally important to monitor the status of our ocean ecosystems. We must act now to ensure a healthy ocean for our children.





REEF CHECK'S SUSTAINABLE SOLUTIONS

The non-profit Reef Check Foundation was established in 1997 to reverse the world's coral reef crisis by engaging citizens, business, and government in research, conservation, and management. Reef Check California's goals are to:

- Establish a state-wide monitoring network using trained volunteer divers to conduct scientific surveys.
- Develop an informed and educated constituency supporting science-based management.
- Provide data to help resource managers make informed management decisions.
- Develop a self-financing monitoring and management program.
- Involve California divers in solving the tropical coral reef crisis through the Reef Check EcoAction and EcoExpedition programs.

To accomplish these goals, Reef Check scientists train and supervise teams of volunteers to conduct surveys of subtidal reefs. The results of these surveys are then submitted to Reef Check headquarters for compilation and analysis, and made available to all interested parties on a web-based Geographic Information System.
